Erikson Institute's Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Certificate Program is a graduate academic program designed to support experienced professionals working with infants, young children, and families. Students learn to support the mental health and social-emotional needs of infants, young children, and their families. Students in the Infant Mental Health Program come from a variety of

backgrounds including social work, psychology, child development, early childhood education, early intervention, and other fields working with infants and young children.

The program is 18-credit hours completed over two academic years. This program is fully online with a combination of synchronous and asynchronous classes. Ideal candidates for this program are experienced professionals who are interested in enhancing their professional capacities with an infant and early childhood mental health lens. A minimum of a bachelor's degree with 3-5 years of experience is required for admission.

Applications are currently being accepted for the 2021-2022 school year. All applicants will be considered for scholarship funding.
