WHEREAS: We must recognize the vital work performed by early care and education professionals, express our gratitude for their important services and support efforts to see that they are fairly compensated; and


Now, therefore, I, Nicolas AbouAssaly, Mayor of the City of Marion, Iowa, do hereby proclaim April 10-16, 2021 as
